Amarsaikhan wuchs in einer traditionellen Nomadenfamilie auf. Seit 2009 fokussiert er seine Arbeiten sowohl auf die Erhaltung der Nomadenkultur als auch auf deren Wandel im Lauf der Zeit. Seine Kunst treibt das Anliegen, diese Kultur durch künstlerischen Ausdruck zu bewahren, in dem er seine Werke der Welt präsentiert. Amarsaikhan grew up in a traditional nomadic family. Since 2009, he has been developing a project on the persistence and the transformation of "nomadic culture". The once admired and often romanticized Mongolian nomadic culture is changing and losing more and more of its traditions due to modern world developments. Amarsaikhan sets out to preserve this culture by showing it to the world. His creative means are installations. He uses raw and natural material found on site of the work's location. Born in 1981 in Mongolia, he studied Fine Art in Ulaanbaatar. Solo Exhibitions at UMA Art Gallery & Xanadu Art Gallery in Ulaanbaatar, Red Mill Gallery in Vermont Studio Center, USA.
